

4) Continue ahead keeping to the right hand side of the field, ignoring all sidepaths into the woods. At the bottom of the slope bear right through some trees to a waymarker post indicating a right hand turn up a short steepish slope to a wooden gate. Follow the sunken bridleway through fields (*in the summer the path may well be overgrown and in wet weather may be very wet keep on the edge of the field.*) At the 3rd gate you will get to a track with Cefn Coed Farm up to your left. Cross over the track



5) Go up the slope still following the route of the sunken bridleway through 2 gates. Continue on the bridleway to reach a tarmac road through another gate. Bear right uphill on the road which bends sharp right at the top of the rise and follow the road towards Bailey Einon Farm.

6) Go past Bailey Einion and opposite Llwyn Bongam cross a stile and go up the steep slope, following the direction of the arrow to a stile just beyond some sycamore trees. Turn right and follow the track round the hillside for a 100 metres.

7) At the waymarked post (in 2016 this was broken but on the left is a rocky outcrop) leave the track and go diagonally right up the slope to gate into a copse of fir trees; follow the path through the copse to a gate on the right and bear slightly left down hill across the grass to a waymarked post near gorse bushes which points to a gate. Continue down a pleasant dingle which has a steep gulley to the left and through a metal gate to a housing estate.



Cross the road to a path alongside a stream, you will reach another road. Turn right. After 50m turn left by no.22, into a path round the back of gardens, until you reach a kissing gate on the left.

8) Go up the field diagonally left to a stile, on to a narrow path with a wire fence on the right. This soon broadens out. Go downhill through the trees to the Lake side where you started out.

Walk 4 Bridleways and Footpaths OS Explorer map 200

This is a 5.5km (4 mile) walk, graded as easy. It starts and finishes at Llandrindod Lake where there is parking and a restaurant.

1) With your back to the Lake go down Princes Avenue towards the town. At the T junction turn right and after 100 metres turn left into Beaufort Road. At the cross roads continue into Lant Avenue. When the road forks, bear left and go uphill till you reach a cattle grid on your right. Cross the cattle grid on to a grassy area which used to be a quarry. Go along the tarmac track until the finger post directs you to go left across the grass with a low cliff on your right which was once a quarry face.



2) At the next waymark post bear right crossing a narrow sunken track.

This was the route of a wooden tram track that carried quarried stone down to the railway. The quarry workings broke through into an underground stream which flooded the workings and created a 'bottomless' pool.

Go ahead, keeping the fence on your right, to a stile into another field. Maintain your direction with the trees to the right and then up a steepish bank and cross the stile at the top.

Continue to follow the tree line on your right as it curves and the field narrows. Look out for the stile in the hedge on the left which will take you into a lane.

3) Cross over and go ahead into a narrower lane.



Go straight ahead There are no waymarkers until, after a sharp S-bend, the lane widens and there is a waymarker next to a farm gate on your left. Go through this gate on to a wide track which goes uphill.



Continue till you see a waymarked bridge gate and a farmgate.

For the main route go through the bridge gate, downhill and get to a field through another bridge gate. Go through to a grassy field which has a slight slope downwards, with a tree covered slope to the right.

(To shorten the walk go through the farmgate and follow the wide track which is a much drier route round the hill to point 5 where you can see Cefn Coed farm straight ahead. Before the gate to Cefn Coed turn right on to the route of the bridleway)
