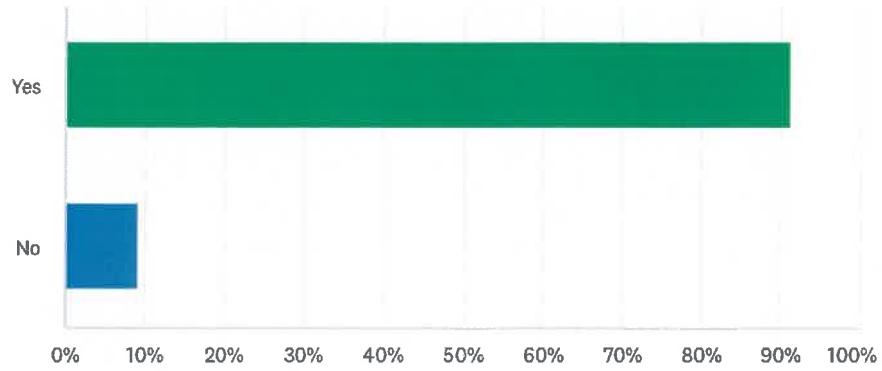


Q1 Are you opposed to this development?

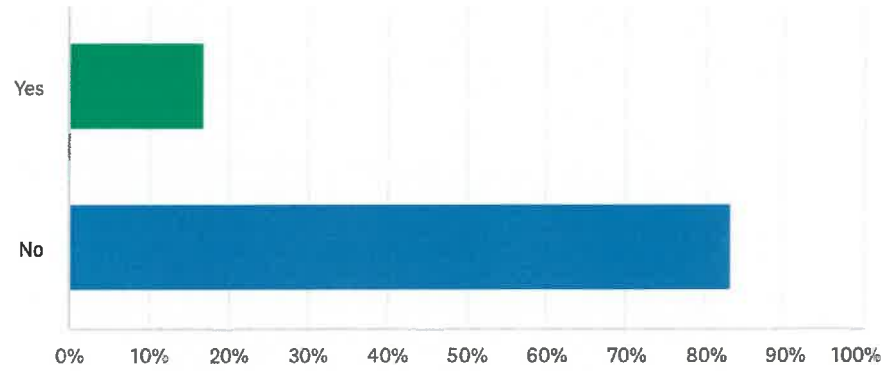

Q2 Do you want wind farms in Mid Wales?

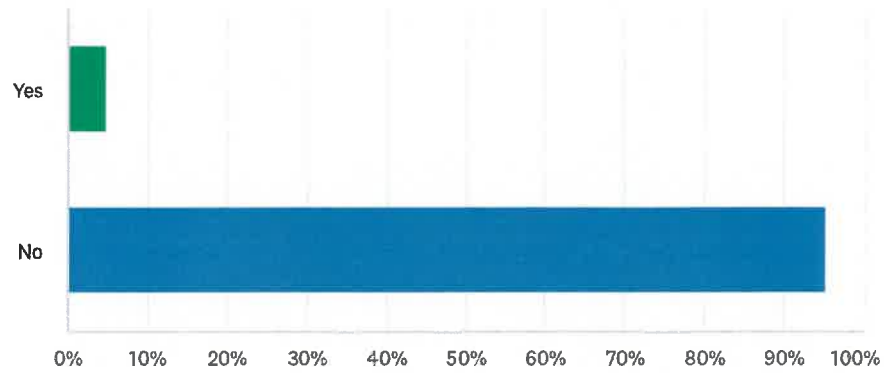

Q3 Do you want pylons in Mid Wales?

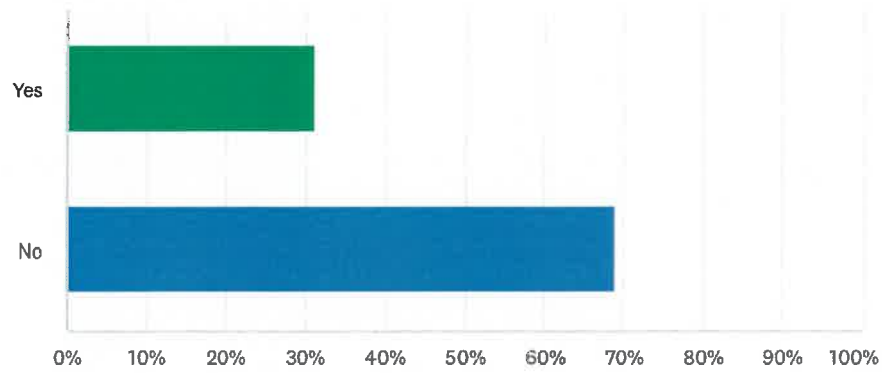

Q4 Would you be happy with wind farms if the cables were laid underground?

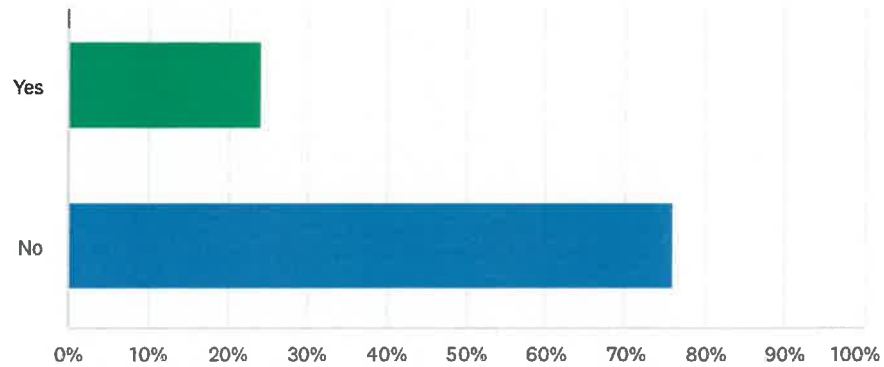

Q5 Are you happy to have wind farms and pylons or cables, as a sustainable energy source?

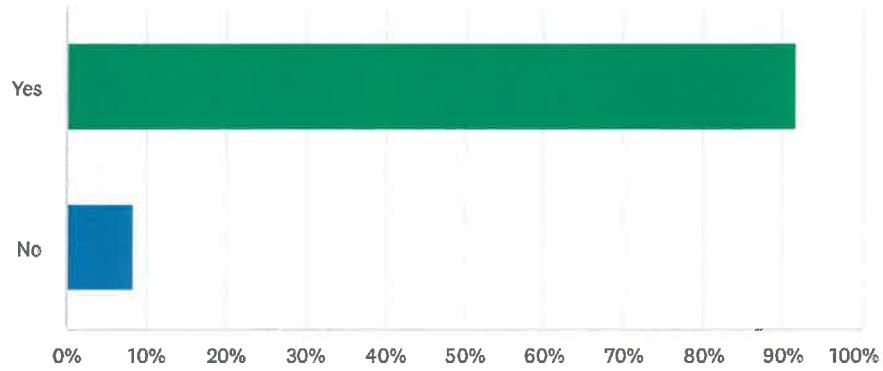

Q6 Do you feel off-shore wind farms are a better solution to generate energy?

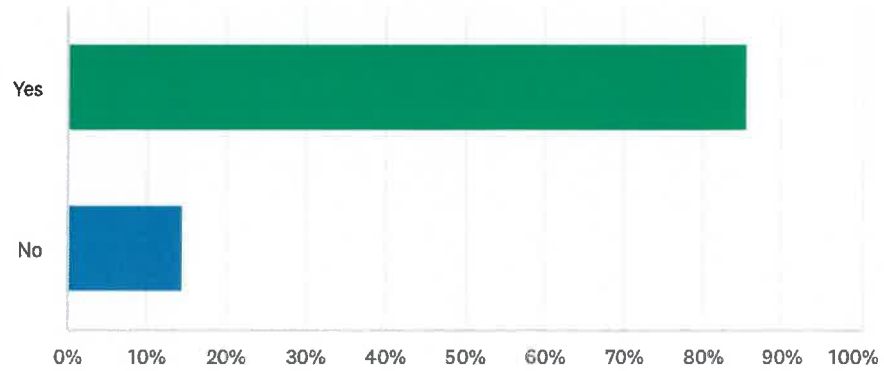

Q7 Would you prefer not to have any wind farms within your area?

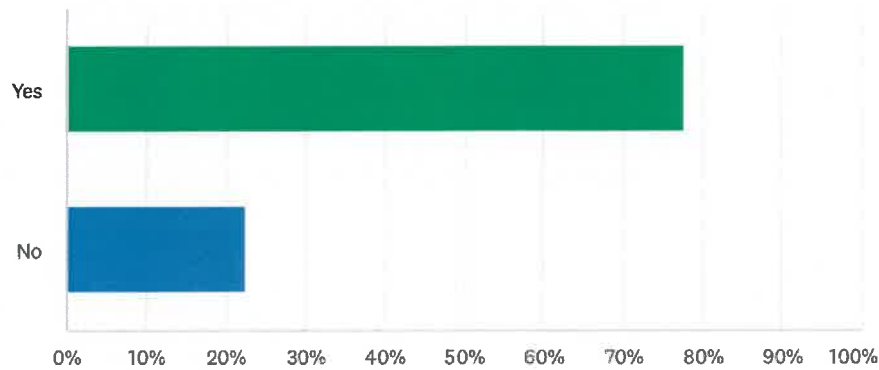

What is even more damaging is the infrastructure needed to convey the electricity generated. From the hundreds of M3 of concrete (one of the most carbon-intensive manufacturing processes known to man) needed for each turbine base, to the transportation of the abnormal loads, the steel reinforcements for the bases, the steel and aluminium of the towers, nacelles, blades and rotors. All of these things have to be made. Making anything produces carbon. Enormous pits will need to be blasted and dug into hillsides to bury these concrete foundations. The peat displaced sequesters carbon and will have taken hundreds of thousands of years to form. The unique fauna and flora of mid- and mid-West Wales's uplands will be severely compromised - deaths of birds and bats through collision with turbine blades, in particular, are well documented. Onshore wind is far too variable; offshore is much more reliable. This variability leads to very high fluctuations in output as anyone monitoring https://www.gridwatch.templar.co.uk/ would know. Many rare earth minerals are needed - in fact a wind turbine uses about a ton of each of neodymium, praseodymium, dysprosium, and terbium. "Community Benefit Funds" are often risible and, in the case of one local wind farm (Hendy) have not been paid out as this will only become the case when the turbines produce power; as they are not connected to the Grid, no monies have been paid out. The HVLS suspended from pylon to pylon are known to be a detriment to health (cancers & more) for those living nearby. The shadow-flicker produced by turbines is a major concern. Mid-Wales has two areas with International Dark Sky Status: the Elan Valley and Bannau Brycheiniog NP; these will be severely compromised by the aviation warning/safety lights that turbines will have to have fitted. Tourism will be badly affected as the area is renowned for its peace, tranquility and activities associated with the great outdoors. Those who come to visit or stay come here for its vistas, its emptiness (it contains some of the few remaining wildernesses in the UK), its clean air, wildlife and the fact that it is generally-speaking unspoilt. Wales generates sufficient electricity to meet present demand and does not need further wind farm developments. The policies of Future Wales 2040 and Net Zero 2050 (as amended by Dr Jane Davidson's Wales Net Zero Challenge 2035 group) are highly politicised and not closely allied to reality. Small-scale renewables should be the way forward, including covering many existing (urban or quasi urban) surfaces (predominantly roofs) with solar PV and solar thermal panels. Constructors' profit margins can well suffer the reduction that a change in planning legislation and building regulations would bring should it be mandatory for all new-builds to have a) much higher levels of insulation and b) have every possible square inch covered in energy-generating panels. Mid-Wales's economy is a very fragile one and without the income and contributions to its economy that tourists bring, it will suffer.

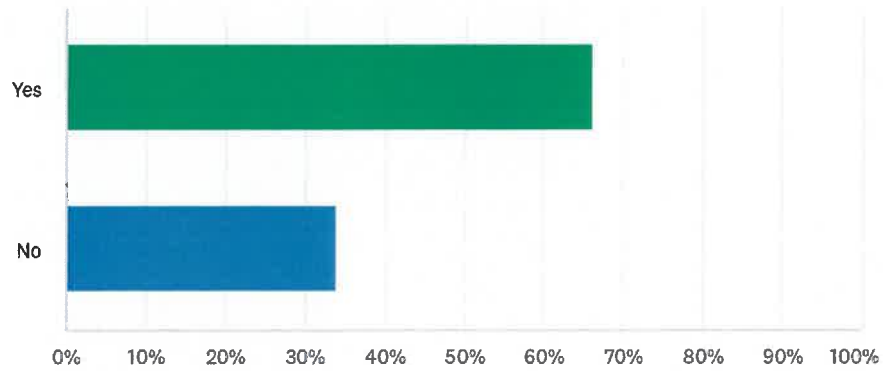
